# Your Support Prevents and Ends Homelessness

#### Dear Friends,

A January 2024 point-in-time count found that non-migrant homelessness in Chicago increased by 25 percent from 2023 to 2024. Now more than ever, Renaissance is being called upon to deliver proven solutions to homelessness that help individuals and families achieve lasting stability.

In late 2023, Renaissance secured new federal and state grant funding to expand key programs in response to rising need. Over the course of 2024, Renaissance will:

### Add 195 units of housing to its

permanent supportive housing programs, including units in the newly renovated Covent Hotel in Lincoln Park (in partnership with NPH Foundation) and Lawson House on the Near North Side (in partnership with Holsten)

#### Launch an innovative Triage Bridge Housing

program that will maintain 30 apartments and provide health assessment services to rapidly house vulnerable, unsheltered individuals and connect them to health care and longterm permanent housing Expand our homeless street outreach services by adding specially trained Health Outreach Workers and Peer Outreach Workers with lived experience of homelessness, and a second outreach van

### Participants Achieve Transformative Outcomes

With support from Renaissance's dedicated and compassionate team members, participants achieved significant personal outcomes in 2023:



#### For the community as a whole, Renaissance's services deliver significant social return on investment.

Homelessness is expensive. Research from a team at the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business found that dollars invested in Renaissance yield substantial savings in medical bills, law enforcement, and shelter costs — even before accounting for the long-term costs of homelessness.

#### $\$1.00 \rightarrow \$1.27$

Every dollar invested in our Permanent Supportive Housing program yields \$1.27 in social savings.

#### $\$1.00 \rightarrow \$1.90$

Every dollar invested in our Family Support Program yields \$1.90 in social savings, largely due to the added benefits of serving children.

#### $\$1.00 \rightarrow \$1.46$

Every dollar invested in our Homelessness Prevention Program yields \$1.46 in social savings, because preventing an eviction in the first place is much less costly and disruptive for families.

## Our Approach to Ending Homelessness Works



Outreach & Engagement: Street outreach teams visit shelters and encampments on a regular basis to engage with people and support them in moving into housing and engaging in health care. As a key partner in Chicago's Flexible Housing Pool (FHP), Renaissance conducts outreach to homeless people who have been identified as high utilizers of the health care system and engages them into support services, housing, and health care.

Homelessness Prevention: Renaissance prevents homelessness in Chicago by providing short-term emergency funds and services to people at risk of losing their homes.

**Diversion Housing:** Renaissance provides temporary housing for individuals with serious mental health issues awaiting placement into permanent housing. Temporary housing is more stable than shelter or hospitalization and can improve individuals' health outcomes.


Rapid Re-Housing: For individuals and families who do not need intensive and long-term supports to exit homelessness and maintain permanent housing, Renaissance provides short-term housing assistance and case management that focuses on building individuals' income and strengths.

Permanent Supportive Housing: In partnership with landlords across Chicago, Renaissance operates site-based and scattered-site permanent supportive housing programs, offering rent subsidies, wraparound supportive services, and behavioral health care to help individuals, families, and seniors increase their stability and autonomy.

In 2024, Renaissance will launch a Triage Bridge Housing Program to provide immediate access to a temporary, furnished apartment to vulnerable people engaged through its Homeless Street Outreach Program. Once housed, Renaissance assesses their needs and places them into appropriate permanent housing.

Behavioral Health Care: Renaissance provides mental health and substance use recovery services to individuals and families in their homes. The Hospital Engagement Pilot Program supports unhoused adults following their discharge from West Side safety-net hospitals, providing recovery support services, housing placement assistance, and connection to resources.

I've been working at Renaissance for nearly four years. I used to work in inpatient case management at a nursing home and started working with Renaissance at the Lawson House, our permanent supportive housing residence recently renovated by our partners at Hosten. Every client has their own stories. They want housing and are so grateful for this opportunity. They put in the work to find stability. The small things mean the most to them, like support to do their laundry.

Some of our participants are alone and sometimes the case managers are their only source of personal support. I love the team at Renaissance. We all share the same goals.



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

## Our Commitment to Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility


